

Greetings from Wasem Fruit Farm:

Spring has arrived and all the Pussy willows have been harvested for the season! Come to the orchard or visit us at Ann Arbor Farmers Market to pick up a bouquet or wreath along with fresh cider, donuts, apples and other orchard goodies.

Open the next three Fridays; March 29th, April 5th and 12th from 9am until 5:00pm. We will be at the Ann Arbor Farmers Market (315 Detroit St.) Saturday March 30th, April 6th and 13th. The market is open from 8am until 3:00pm. We will be in our regular stalls 6-9. Pussy willow will be available in bunches ranging from 6 inches to 6 feet, along with wreaths and curly willow in assorted sizes. Right now, while supplies last, we have the traditional ones, curly willow, black and wide fantail Japanese ones. Some bouquets are a mixture of all, so stunning, truly treasures of nature.

Wasem presses fresh cider weekly. This time of year, we do not press as much due to our limited hours. We are able to take orders for large quantities so please let us know by Wednesday if we can help you with an order. We have the mulling spices for hot cider too!

We do not make as many donuts this time of year so we appreciate orders placed in advance. Call 734-482-2342 or direct message on our Facebook page to be sure to get all your favorites. Please include: name, phone number, quantity, type of batter and topping. We make plain, apple, cherry and blueberry. Toppings are plain, glazed or cinnamon. If you expect to come late in the day, you may want to place an order for your donuts so you will be sure to get your favorites.

Jan has been busy restocking her jams and will have a large selection at the orchard and farmers market, while supplies last. Please remember to return your jam jars for .20 cents back.
